### Key Uses

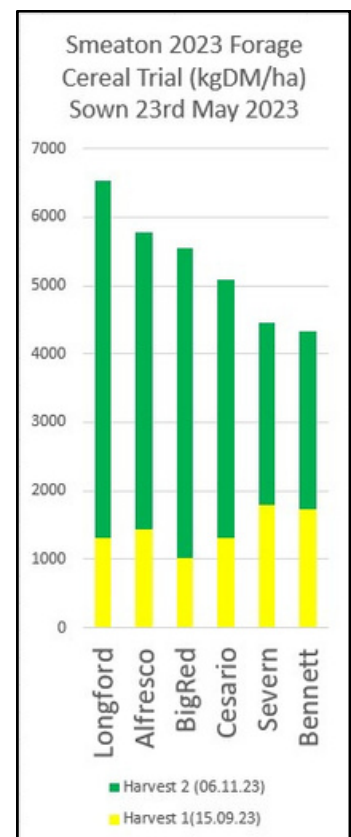

### Grazing

Alfresco is a Spring Wheat without a vernalization requirement. If a wider grazing window is required, Longford Winter Wheat should be considered.

### Mixes

Mixes well with Vampire Ryecorn, Longford Wheat, Prodigy Ryegrass and legumes such as Benetas Vetch.
